COMMUNITY and POPULATION

Greenwood Christian School serves students from Abbeville, Greenwood, Edgefield, Laurens, McCormick, and Saluda counties in South Carolina. Our current enrollment is 442 students; 208 Pre-K/Elementary, 98 Middle School; 136 High School. The population of the student body is 85% Caucasian, 6% African American, 4% Hispanic, 5% other.

SCHOOL

Greenwood Christian High School is a comprehensive four-year private high school with a current enrollment of 136 students. Greenwood Christian School was established in August of 1992 and graduated its first class in 1993. GCS is accredited by ACTS (nationally), Cognia (regionally), and is a member of SCISA (statewide). GCS also earned an accreditation certificate granted by the National Council for Private School Accreditation.

The academic program is organized on a hybrid block/period schedule. Block classes meet for 90 minutes every day for one semester. Period classes meet 50 minutes every day all year.

CURRICULUM

All of our courses are classified as either CP, Honors, or Dual Enrollment. Honors classes are offered in all levels of high school English, Mathematics, and Science. Honors classes are also offered in Government, Geography, US History, Bible, and Coding. Admittance into honors classes is determined by grades from previous classes per our student handbook.

We currently offer the following Dual Enrollment courses taught on-site through Piedmont Technical College: English 101, 102, 201, 202; Religion 103; Philosophy:Ethics 110; Music Appreciation 105; Psychology 201 and 212. In addition to these, students have access to off-site Dual Enrollment courses from the catalogs of Piedmont Technical College, Lander University, and other SC colleges.

GPA is calculated at the end of each semester. All grades, including failing grades, are included to calculate the GPA. Class rank is based on GPA at the end of each semester. New students are not ranked until completion of two semesters, and part-time students are not ranked.

STANDARDIZED TEST RESULTS
